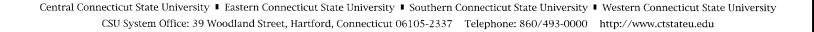
## RESOLUTION

concerning

## FY2002-03 TUITION AND FEES SCHEDULES FOR CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS TIER I & II

#### December 7, 2001

- WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees for the Connecticut State University System under its statutory authority CGS 10a-99 reviews and establishes fees annually for such purposes as the Board of Trustees deems necessary, and
- WHEREAS, The recommendations were developed through a process which involved discussions among student groups, university management, the System Office and the Trustees, and
- WHEREAS, Suggested tuition and fee planning guidelines which took into consideration the level of funds needed to ensure continued quality of university programmatic offerings as well as various other aspects of campus life were established in September, 2001, and
- WHEREAS, Revenues projected at current rates will not be sufficient to cover collective bargaining requirements, inflationary increases, equipment and furniture replacement needs, and
- WHEREAS, Increases are therefore recommended in tuition, course fees, the university general fee, the university fee, the information technology fee, housing, and food service fees, and
- WHEREAS, Fifteen (15) percent of tuition revenues are allocated to student financial aid to offset tuition and fee costs for the most needy students, and
- WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees is mandated by Section 10a-26 of the Connecticut General Statutes to prorate tuition of full-time students carrying less than 75% of full-time load of courses, and
- WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees has issued definitions of students for fee payment and enrollment reporting purposes in Board Resolution 79-93, and



- WHEREAS, The Connecticut State University System debt service requirements for the self-supporting facilities program have been evaluated, and it has been determined that a modest increase in the University Fee will be required to meet projected debt service needs, therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the rates reflected on the attached schedules (1 7) are effective at each university and *OnlineCSU* as appropriate for FY2002-03.

FY2002-03 Tuition and Fees Schedules for Connecticut State University Students Tier I & II

## BACKGROUND

The Board of Trustees under its statutory authority - CGS 10a-99 - reviews and establishes fees annually for such purposes as the Board of Trustees deems necessary. Recommendations are developed through a process which involves discussions among university and System Office management and Trustees. Discussions generally focus upon issues relating to university programmatic and administrative needs and priorities, the cost to students, the economy, political considerations, and other factors. Additionally, students are advised of the proposed tuition and fee recommendations and voice their concurrence or non-concurrence.

## ANALYSIS

In September 2001, suggested FY2002-03 tuition and fee planning guidelines were recommended which proposed a uniform 4.25% increase for undergraduate and graduate programs on a campus-by-campus basis. The guidelines took into consideration the trend in the Higher Education Price Index (HEPI), which was 4.1% in FY2000 and 4.8% for FY2001, as well as escalating utility and library costs and anticipated collective bargaining increases.

**Funding Strategies**: A number of initiatives to increase funding at the universities are underway and will continue into the future. The actions are highlighted below:

- The Board of Trustees, universities and the System Office are continuing an awareness enhancing program to obtain Executive, Legislative and public support for CSU's Strategic Plan.
- The universities and the System Office are effecting programmatic adjustments and reallocations of financial resources consistent with their strategic plans as opportunities present themselves.
- The universities and the System Office have designed and are implementing development plans intended to increase fund-raising, encompassing major gifts, planned giving, and annual giving.

## Suggested Tuition and Fee Planning Guidelines:

- Tuition for undergraduate and graduate programs may be increased by 4.25%.
- A differential tuition rate increase may be established for certain graduate programs on a program-by-program basis.



- Undergraduate and Graduate Course Fees may be tailored to meet competition, based upon market analysis that was performed by each campus and presented to the Finance and Administration Committee of the Board of Trustees.
- University General Fee may be increased up to a maximum of 5%. The base upon which the fee increase is calculated excludes student accident insurance. This maximum may be exceeded in the case of additional documented needs approved by the Board of Trustees.
- Housing and food service fees may be increased in the aggregate up to a maximum of 4% depending upon the marketplace and the need to recover overhead costs related to the particular activity. The Food Service fee guideline may be impacted by future contract negotiations or increased food costs. The base for calculating the fees excludes the telecommunication charge, the cable television charge, and other specialty charges.
- University Fee is to be increased by 3.5% as required for debt service needs.
- The Information Technology Fee for full-time students will remain at \$150.00. The Information Technology Fee for part-time students will increase to \$8.00 per credit hour.

During the Tuition and Fee hearings with the Finance and Administration Committee, it was agreed that the increase in tuition for undergraduate and graduate programs would be limited to 3.9%. Additionally, it was agreed that the Information Technology Fee for full-time students would increase to \$200.00.

A general summary of the universities' fee requests is shown below:

**Central:** Requested fee increases generally fall within suggested guidelines and will provide sufficient revenues to meet anticipated expenditures. Central's University General Fee is proposed to increase 18.0%, primarily due to increased costs for parking garage construction, athletics, and campus security. Also, Central is proposing a new \$20 Media Fee, as well as increases in the Transcript Fee and the Nautilus User Fee.

**Eastern:** Requested fee increases generally fall within suggested guidelines and will provide sufficient revenues to meet anticipated expenditures. Eastern is proposing an increase in their University General Fee of 21.7% due primarily to the addition of a \$100 parking fee. Additionally, the increase will provide funds to create new student employment opportunities on campus. The Food Service Fee is proposed to increase 5% to cover rising labor costs. Eastern is also proposing increases in the Transcript Fee and the Installment Payment Program fee.

**Southern:** Requested fee increases are within suggested guidelines and will provide sufficient revenues to meet anticipated expenditures. Southern is proposing an increase in the University General Fee of 27.4%, reflecting an

increase in the parking fee and funding for increases in shuttle service, an increase in the Student Center budget, and needed services for intercollegiate athletics and intramurals. Additionally, Southern is proposing a new \$20 Media Fee and a new Undergraduate Nursing Lab Fee (\$300 per semester for full-time students, \$25 per credit hour for part time students), as well as an increase in the Transcript Fee.

Western: Requested fee increases generally fall within suggested guidelines and will provide sufficient revenues to meet anticipated expenditures. The University General Fee is requested to increase by 19.1%, mainly due to the addition of a \$100 parking fee to finance a parking garage and/or additional surface lot on the Westside Campus. Additionally, the increase will allow for improvements in Student Center operations, the transfer of athletic teams' use of vans to buses, and an increase in the meal allowance for athletes, which had not been changed in over ten years. Western is also proposing a 4.8% increase in the Housing Fee, and a \$3,000 per semester hotel fee, to be charged to those students housed in a hotel in the case of a shortage of on-campus housing. Western is also proposing increases to the Transcript Fee, the Teacher Certification/Transcript Evaluation Fee, the Applied Music Fee, and the Installment Payment Program fee.

**OnlineCSU:** OnlineCSU is proposing differentiated fees for in-state and out-ofstate students for the first time in FY2002-03. Part-time fees are proposed to increase 9.1% for in-state undergraduates and 36.4% for out-of-state undergraduates; and 7.7% for in-state graduate students and 34.6% for out-ofstate graduate students. The Online Fee is proposed to increase by \$3, while the Incomplete/Access Fee is not changing.

**University Fee:** An increase of 3.5% (\$24 for in-state students) in the University Fee for FY2002-03 is recommended. An ongoing analysis of future debt service requirements confirms the need to annually increase this fee. The fee pays for debt service on bonds issued through the Connecticut Health and Education Facilities Authority (CHEFA) as well as outstanding general obligation self-liquidating bonds issued by the State of Connecticut. The bonds are used to finance student auxiliary facilities, which allows student facilities to move through the construction process at a pace more consistent with the university master plans.

**Student Accident and Sickness Insurance:** The insurance program is in the process of being rebid. It is anticipated that a new insurance contract will be finalized in early February 2002. The new rate structure will be brought to the Board for approval subsequent to that date.

The Student Advisory Board met on November 13, 2001 to hear the proposed tuition and fees. After the presentation, some concerns were noted by the students. The student representatives from Central were concerned that reductions to athletic budgets were occurring in spite of the fact that a \$150 athletic fee to be added to the University General Fee was approved last year. The students expressed concerns regarding the State budget cuts, and their effect on tuition rates. The student representative from Southern expressed concern regarding total pricing for out-ofstate students, as well as the cost of 300-level summer courses, given the fact that the university is considering reducing the price for 100- and 200-level summer courses. However, in spite of these concerns, the Student Advisory Board approved the proposed tuition and fee increases by majority vote.

The recommended tuition and fee increases are essential and will provide funding to meet arbitrated salary awards, inflationary increases, new strategic initiatives, and necessary equipment and furniture replacement needs. Approval of these tuition and fee recommendations will permit the universities to continue to offer excellent academic programs, effectively administered in a quality campus environment.
