Dear Dr. Smith:

In accordance with advice from the Assistant Attorney General, Michael Ahern, I wish to submit for Board of Trustee approval permission to have illegally parked cars towed from the campus at the expense of the owner.

Rationale - The present system of fines inflicted upon students, faculty or visitors who park illegally and violate the traffic regulations is having too little effect in obtaining compliance and the protection of pedestrian and property on the Campus of Southern Connecticut State College. Upon inquiry, Assistant Attorney General Ahern advised that the College could legally tow improperly parked cars from the Campus at the owner's expense provided, however, that the areas were so posted, notice of such practice was printed in the College Catalog, and the practice was approved by the Board of Trustees.

Since notice of such a regulation has been printed in our College Catalog and signs are ready for installation, permission is requested to establish a policy that improperly and illegally parked cars may be towed from the Campus at the owner's expense.

It will be helpful if this permission can be granted at the April 11th Board of Trustees meeting.
