AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION

concerning

Approval of the Sixth Year Program in Administration and Supervision

at Southern Connecticut State College

May 2, 1969

RESOLVED, that Southern Connecticut State College be authorized to begin the Sixth Year Program in Administration and Supervision in September 1969 or as soon thereafter as practicable provided the College will have appointed two new full-time professors of educational administration.

RESOLUTION

That Southern Connecticut State College be authorized to begin the Sixth Year Program in Administration and Supervision in September 1969 or as soon thereafter as practicable provided the college will have appointed two new full-time professors of educational administration and also provided that the emphasis be placed upon the preparation of supervisors, directors, and consultants in fields such as special education, health and physical education, early childhood education, art, science, social studies, language arts, reading, and speech and hearing on both the elementary and secondary school levels.

Report on New Program Proposals from the Colleges

June 6, 1969

On May 2, 1969, the Board of Trustees for State Colleges approved several new programs for the colleges as recommended by the Planning Committee of the Board.

On May 2 also, the Planning Committee's recommendations were placed before the Commission for Higher Education for approval as required by statute.

The Commission approved the recommended programs as below.

(Underlined statements were added by the Commission.)

Central Connecticut State College

- (1) Master of Science in Education of Guidance Counselors (Sept.1969 or later)
- (2) Master of Arts in Mathematics (Sept.1969 or later)
- (3) Sixth-Year Program in Reading (Sept. 1969 or later)

Eastern Connecticut State College

- (1) Bachelor of Arts in Biology, English and History with Minor in Secondary Education (Sept.1970 or later)
- (2) Master of Science for Reading Consultants (Summer 1970 or later)
- (3) Bachelor of Arts in Applied Social Relations (Sept.1969 or later)

Southern Connecticut State College

- (1) Master of Arts in English (Sept.1969 or later)
- (2) Master of Arts in Modern Languages (French and Spanish) (Sept.1969 or later)
- (3) Sixth-Year Program in Speech and Hearing (Sept.1969 or later)
- (4) Sixth-Year Program in Administration and Supervision (Sept.1969 or later) provided the college will have appointed two new full-time professors of educational administration; and provided the program will focus on preparation of supervisors, directors and consultants in fields such as Special Education, Health and Physical Education, Early Childhood Education, Art, Science, Social Studies, Language Arts, Reading and Speech and Hearing on both elementary and secondary school levels; and provided also that the emphasis will not be on preparation of school principals and assistant superintendents.

Western Connecticut State College

(1) Master of Arts in English (Sept. 1969 or later)

On May 2 the Commission tabled the following programs for further consideration:

- (1) Bachelor of Science in Art Education (Central)
- (2) Bachelor of Science in Music Education (Central)
- (3) Sixth-Year Counselor Education Program (Southern)

On June 4 the Commission and its committees took the following action on the three tabled proposals:

- (1) Approved the Sixth-Year Counselor Education Program for Southern Connecticut State College to begin in September 1969 or later.
- (2) Kept on the table the two programs proposed for Central Connecticut State College (Bachelor of Science in Art Education & Bachelor of Science in Music Education) pending a CHE study of the need for professional personnel in the two fields and, if the need exists, an exploration of alternative ways of satisfying the need.
