Mr. Dagata, Public Works Department, called me requesting that a condemnation resolution for the Poulin property be brought before the Board of Trustees for the State Colleges. Mr. Dagata stated that the delay by the state in acquiring the Poulin property has created a serious hardship for Mr. and Mrs. Poulin. Mrs. Poulin is a cardiac and is no longer able to live in a two-story house. The Poulin's built a one-story ranch home and have moved to this property. The announced expansion plans of CCSC have made it almost impossible for the Poulin's to sell their property located at 25 Stratford Road, New Britain, Connecticut. The Poulin's do not object to the state acquiring their property, but have requested condemnation in an effort to obtain a greater sum than they were offered by the State of Connecticut for their property.
