This is to confirm that the Commission for Higher Education at its January 11, 1972 meeting, based upon the recommendation of the Board of Trustees for State Colleges, voted approval for program development of the following:

Bachelor of Science in Education (for the preparation of teachers of Nurse-aides and Licensed Fractical Nurses as well as School Nurseteachers and Extended Care Facility Nurse-teachers) at Central Connecticut State College.

This favorable coordinating action taken by the Commission is contingent on the availability of appropriate resources and carries the understanding that such programs are subject to the usual licensing and accreditation by the Commission for Higher Education and the appropriate professional agency concerned, prior to offering these programs.

It was voted: favorable recommendation to the Commission for Higher Education for coordination contingent on the expectation that three conditions would be fulfilled:

- 1. Expanded representation from the nursing field in program development, eg., an in or out-of-state consultant in nursing professions education.
- 2. As developments move toward accreditation, careful attention would be focused on the <u>content</u> of the clinical courses and <u>relationships</u> of the college with clinical facilities.
- 3. Especially with respect to aspects of the program concerned with preparing nurse-teacheres in schools and extended-care facilities, special attention should be devoted to liaison with the State Department of Education.
