OPERATING BUDGET REQUESTS FOR THE STATE COLLEGES

1973-1974 FISCAL YEAR

July 14, 1972 (Revised from April 7, 1972)

RESOLVED, That for the purpose of submitting a 1973/74 Operating Budget Request for the four State Colleges to the Commission for Higher Education and the Budget Division, a total amount of \$35,814,678, as recommended by the Budget Committee, is approved by the Board of Trustees with the stipulation that a variation of 1% will be permitted for the final budget submission.

RESOLVED, That for the purpose of submitting a 1973/74 Operating Budget Request for the Central Office of the Board of Trustees for State Colleges to the Commission for Higher Education and the Budget Division, a total amount of \$305,559, as recommended by the Budget Committee, is approved by the Board of Trustees with the stipulation that a variation of \$25,000 will be permitted for the final budget submission.

TO: Bernice C. Niejadlik, Chairman and Members of the Board of Trustees

A very careful time-table and set of procedures for the development of the budgets for the four State Colleges has evolved in order for the colleges to make the necessary careful preparation of their budget requests.

The 1973-74 budget formation began in February 1972 when the formulae for building the budget, the general format, and approximate level were agreed upon. The Budget Committee of the Board approved the budget request in March, and the full Board gave its approval at its meeting on April 7, 1972. This budget amounted to \$39,628,465. After receiving the Governor's directive on May 17, 1972 regarding a "zero budgeting" concept for the 1973-74 budget requests from state agencies, the colleges reviewed the original budget request and revised it downward. This reduced budget, to be submitted to the Board at its meeting on July 14, is in the amount of \$35,814,678. To this is added a requested amount of \$305,559 for the central office of the Board of Trustees.

In order to make a reduction in the amounts originally requested for the colleges, the following improvement factors that are still regarded as important are being eliminated:
