RESOLUTION

concerning

Portable Classrooms

at

Southern Connecticut State College

June 4, 1973

- WHEREAS, Southern Connecticut State College requires classroom facilities, and
- WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees for State Colleges has the option under contract arrangements with the General Rental Leasing Company of Stamford, Connecticut, to purchase or continue to lease six (6) portable classroom buildings now on campus, and
- WHEREAS, The purchase of said facilities at the end of four years of the initial lease term (on or about September 5, 1973) will result in a total saving of \$4,254 to the State of Connecticut, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees authorize the purchase of the above six portable classroom facilities.

Justification for Purchase of Portable Classroom Buildings Southern Connecticut State College

On April 1, 1969, the Board of Trustees signed a five (5) year lease with the General Rental Leasing Company of Stamford, Connecticut for six (6) portable classroom buildings. Said contract was effective with the acceptance of the buildings on September 5, 1969. These buildings are leased at an annual rate of \$19,326.00. According to the terms of the lease the buildings may be purchased at the end of four (4) years of the initial lease term for the sum of \$16,137.00. This four year period will expire on September 5, 1973. If the option to purchase is exercised on the date noted it will result in a savings of \$3,189.00 from the annual lease cost for the period from September 5, 1973 to September 4, 1974. There will be additional savings of \$900.00 which would be the required purchase price if the purchase option is not exercised until the last date of lease period, and \$165.00 for annual liability insurance premiums required by terms of the lease.

It is the recommendation of Dr. Jennings that these buildings be purchased effective September 5, 1973. The buildings have been well maintained and are in good condition so that a number of additional years of service can be expected without due maintenance costs. They have a high rate of utilization and are essential to the academic program of the college.

Dear Dr. Frost:

On April 1, 1969, the Board of Trustees signed a five (5) year lease with the General Rental Leasing Company of Stamford, Connecticut for six (6) portable classroom buildings. These buildings are leased at an annual rate of \$19,326.00. According to the terms of the lease the buildings may be purchased at the end of four (4) years of the initial lease term for the sum of \$16,137.00. This four year period will expire on March 31, 1973. If the option to purchase is exercised on the date noted it will result in a savings of \$3,189.00 from the annual lease cost for the period from April 1, 1973 to March 31, 1974. There will be additional savings of \$900.00, which would be the required purchase price if the purchase option is not exercised until the last date of lease period, and \$165.00 for annual insurance premiums required by terms of the lease.

It is my recommendation that these buildings be purchased effective April 1, 1973. The buildings have been well maintained and are in good condition so that a number of additional years of service can be expected without undue maintenance costs. They have a high rate of utilization and are essential to the academic program of the college.

I request that this recommendation be placed on the agenda for the next meeting of the Planning Committee of the Board of Trustees. Following their approval, an appropriate resolution should be prepared for consideration and approval by the Board of Trustees for the State Colleges at its December meeting.



Dear Dr. Frost:

I have received from President Jennings a copy of the letter addressed to you on February 15, 1973 from the General Rental-Leasing Company concerning the notice of intent to purchase the six buildings at the Southern Connecticut State College which are leased from that company.

The request from the college to purchase the buildings effective April 1, 1973, was based on the copy of the completed lease form which had been forwarded to us. No copy of the letter mentioned as having been written by Mr. Zaniewski, Chief, Lease Division, had been forwarded to the college, so the request to purchase was based on the lease document at hand.

Paragraph 10 of the lease provides for purchase by the lessee at various intervals, including, "... at the end of 4 years of the initial lease term...". There is no definition of what legally constitutes the "initial lease term" that we have discovered in the lease itself.

Paragraph 3(a) of the lease seems to specify Paragraph 24 as establishing the length of the lease period.

Paragraph 24 includes requirements binding upon both Lessor and Lessee, and concludes by indicating a corrected date of April 1, 1969, as the anticipated approximate date of occupancy. It was on the basis of the corrected date shown in this paragraph that our request to purchase was filed.

In reading through the lease, we discover no reference to the first day of rental payment as establishing that day as the beginning of the initial lease term. Nor can we discover any other date defined as such, except the implied date of April 1, 1969, as it appears in Paragraph 24.

Thus, we now are in the position of not knowing specifically what date does constitute legally the beginning date of the initial lease term, nor do we have available at the college the legal resources to do so. The signature page of the lease shows several dates for signatures; Paragraph 24 shows a corrected date of approximately April 1, 1969; page one shows that the lease was entered into on January 6, 1969; and the General Rental-Leasing Company letter indicates the date of September 5, 1969. Perhaps the legal beginning date should be established for the State after a review by the Office of the Attorney General.

At any rate, it is still the express desire of the college to purchase the buildings effective the end of the fourth year of the initial lease term. If this date should be established to be September 4, 1973, the college will institute the necessary procedures for purchase on that date, since apparently no financial advantage would result from purchase at an earlier time. The college will plan to reserve funds from its equipment budget allotment for the 1973-74 fiscal year to effect the purchase.
