RESOLUTION

concerning

The Capital Budget for the New Campus in Danbury for Western Connecticut State College

September 7, 1973

- WHEREAS, There is a continuing need to serve higher education needs of
 the Western portion of the State and to provide for anticipated
 growth of the region, and
- WHEREAS, The approved master plan of Western Connecticut State College identifies projects and facilities needed to provide the first stage of a new campus to serve those purposes, and
- WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees acting under Section 10-328 of the General Statutes, adopted at its July 13, 1973 regular meeting a resolution empowering the Executive Committee to approve a Capital Budget for 1974-75 to be ratified at the September meeting of the Board therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees for the State Colleges ratify an estimated cost of \$24,032,000 in general fund bonds and \$16,168,000 in self-liquidating bonds for the first stage of the new campus for Western Connecticut State College, with costs subject to review of the Department of Public Works. Be it further
- RESOLVED, That no specific amounts will be expended for a project without the express approval of the Board of Trustees.

14,064,000.

This project is not funded.

This project is in the center of the campus and is designed to be the main artery of the campus for communication and for pedestrian movement. It should be constructed as the first project.

If the first phase of the campus is to be constructed for approximately \$17,000,000, additional funds will be needed for 1974 - 1975.
