RESOLUTION

concerning

CONNECTICUT REVIEW

September 7, 1973

WHEREAS, The Connecticut Review serves all four of the State Colleges of Connecticut; be it

RESOLVED, That the cost of the <u>Review</u> be pro-rated among the four colleges; be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board appoint an Advisor to the Review from among its numbers and, if necessary to help him, others chosen from the Board or outside its membership; be it further

RESOLVED, That the Editor of the Review be a member of the faculty of one of the State Colleges; that in addition to his editorial duties he shall teach not more than one-half a teaching load during the academic year; that the summer salary of the Editor be not less than that of his professional rank were he teaching six credits; that if the Editor retires, he may return to his normal teaching duties; be it further

RESOLVED, That the Associate Editor be a member of the faculty of one of the State Colleges and exempt from teaching a one-quarter teaching load during the academic year; and, finally, be it

RESOLVED, That a full-time secretary be assigned to the Editor; and that the host institution be authorized to create a full-time secretarial position.
