The Board of Trustees for the State Colleges at its meeting on April 5, 1974, approved a faculty exchange involving Mr. Ronald J. Fernandez of Central and Miss Elizabeth A. Stevens, a member of Dundee College of Education, Dundee, Scotland. We have been notified that because of a change in plans, Miss Stevens will be unable to come to the United States.

In the meantime, an exchange has been arranged involving Mr. John Morgan of Bingley College of Education, Bingley, Yorkshire, England, for the Fall Semester of the Academic Year, 1974-75. We have entered into similar agreements with Bingley in the past, and arrangements whereby these faculty members will be paid their regular salaries by their respective colleges have been agreed to by Bingley and Central through an inter-institutional agreement.

I am requesting approval by our Board of Trustees for a leave of absence with salary for Mr. Fernandez for the Fall Semester, 1974-75, so that he may accept this assignment in England; as well as a rescission of the April 5th resolution involving Dundee College of Education.
