Release and Circulation of the Proposed Revision
of the
Personnel Policies
of the
Board of Trustees for the State Colleges of Connecticut

May 10, 1974

WHEREAS: The faculty Personnel Policies Review Committee, after extended deliberation and consultation with Trustees, College Presidents, and members of the Central Office, has developed a draft of a

proposed revision of the Personnel Policies; and

WHEREAS: The Trustees desire to have that draft studied by unclassified

professional employees in preparation for campus-wide hearings at which comment and suggestions will be solicited prior to a final restudy and refinement of the draft, be it therefore

RESOLVED: That the Board receives the draft, accepting it only for the

purpose of study and discussion; and therefore be it further

RESOLVED: That the Review Committee draft, dated April 17, 1974, be distri-

buted immediately to every unclassified professional employee of the Board for such study and response, and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees expresses its appreciation to

Professor Theodore Paullin, Chairman of the faculty Personnel Policies Review Committee, and to the other members of the Committee for their contribution to the State Colleges of

Connecticut in the development of this draft.

TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE CONNECTICUT STATE COLLEGES! COMMUNITY

This letter is written on behalf of the Trustees.

The attached draft of a proposed revision of the Personnel Policies was developed by the Personnel Policies Review Committee in consultation with Trustees, College Presidents, and members of the Central Office. It has been accepted by the Trustees only for purposes of study and discussion. It has not been considered for adoption by either the Board as a whole or by the Trustees! Committee on Personnel.

The draft is released at this time so that faculty members and other concerned persons may study it throughout the summer. During September and October the Trustees will hold hearings on each of the State College campuses. Thereafter the draft will be restudied in light of suggestions and criticisms. It is not possible to determine how much time will be needed to arrive at a final draft; however, the earliest possible date for Board approval is December, 1974. It is requested that all concerned persons save this draft for consideration and reference during the months ahead.

Speaking for the Trustees and myself, I wish all members of the State Colleges' community a pleasant and productive summer.
