RESOLUTION

concerning

State College General Fund Enrollments for the 1975-1976 Academic Year

May 10, 1974

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees has reviewed enrollment projections for the State Colleges for the 1975-1976 academic year, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees approves a total General Fund student enrollment of 20,607 for budget purposes at the State Colleges in the 1975-1976 academic year.

STATE COLLEGE PROJECTED GENERAL FUND ENROLLMENTS FOR 1975-1976

Over the three-year period since 1970, the number of full-time equivalent students supported through the general fund has risen from 17,959 to 20,196—an increase of 12.5% over the period and an average yearly increase of about 4.2%. Compared to earlier periods, this growth has been modest and reflects changes in the college going rate of high school students and other trends.

In the 1974-1975 academic year, the operating budget of the State Colleges is based upon a projected 20,400 full-time equivalent students or about a 0 1% increase over actual enrollments of the prior year. The four colleges as a group are now proposing that the 1975-1976 operating budget be based upon a full-time equivalent enrollment of 20,600--an increase of about 1% over the 1974-1975 year. This total represents increases of 150 and 50 at Eastern and Western Connecticut State Colleges respectively.

In the Master Plan prepared by the Commission for Higher Education, a total of 19,800 full-time undergraduate students are projected for the colleges in the Fall of 1974. In the Fall of 1973, the State Colleges actually enrolled 19,570 full-time undergraduate students. (The Commission has made no projections of graduate enrollments.) Over the following four years the Commission projects average growth for the State Colleges of 275 full-time undergraduate students per year.
