
WHEREAS, Public Act 74-266 mandates that the Board of Trustees for State Colleges waive the payment of tuition fees at the State Colleges:

...for any Vietnam Era Veteran, as defined in subsection (a) of Section 27-103 of the General Statutes, who has been accepted for admission to such institution, provided such veteran was a resident of Connecticut at the time he entered the service of the armed forces of the United States or was a resident of Connecticut while so serving and is a resident of Connecticut at the time he is accepted for admission to such institution....,

THEREFORE
BE IT

RESOLVED, That, the Board of Trustees for State Colleges authorizes the waiver of tuition fees for Vietnam Era Veterans as stipulated above beginning in the Fall semester of 1974, subject to the approval of the Commission for Higher Education.

WAIVER OF TUITION FEES FOR

VIETNAM ERA VETERANS

July 19, 1974

WHEREAS, Public Act #74-266 mandates that the Board of Trustees for State Colleges waive the payment of tuition fees at the State Colleges:

...for any Vietnam era veterans as defined in subsection (a) of section 27-103 of the General Statutes, who has been accepted for admission to such institution, provided such veteran was a resident of Connecticut while so serving, and is a resident of Connecticut at the time he is accepted for admission to such institution....,

THEREFORE

BE IT

RESOLVED, That, the Board of Trustees for State Colleges authorizes the waiver of tuition fees for Vietnam era veterans as stipulated above beginning in the Fall semester of 1974, subject to the approval of the Commission for Higher Education.


In Executive Session at the Commission for Higher Education meeting on Tuesday, June 11, 1974, a quorum being present and voting, the following resolutions were approved:


