RESOLUTION

concerning

GIFT TO CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE COLLEGE

November 1, 1974

WHEREAS, Members of the Polish Army Veterans Association, General Haller Post, No. 111, in New Britain, Connecticut, arranged to purchase an 18th Century map of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth, with chronological tables of the Polish Kings, Grand Dukes of Lithuania, and the Grand Masters of the Teutonic Order, and a late 17th or early 18th Century map of Moscovy, Poland, and Little Tartary during the Reign of Tsar Peter Alexovitz (Produced by the Geographer H. Moll), both said to be over 100 years old; and

WHEREAS, The members of General Haller Post No. 111, graciously presented these beautifully framed maps during the formal dedication ceremonies for Copernicus Hall; and

WHEREAS, These maps with appropriate inscriptions designating the members of General Haller Post as doners are to be permanently displayed as part of the Rare Book Collection in Elihu Burritt Library;
