WAIVER OF TUITION AND FEES FOR CERTAIN

STUDENTS FROM NEW BRITAIN MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

ATTENDING CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE COLLEGE

April 2, 1976

WHEREAS, The New Britain Memorial Hospital, a facility for the physically handicapped, is located within close commuting distance of Central Connecticut State College, and

WHEREAS, Several of the patients from this facility have attended Central as parttime students and several are attending now, desiring to be declared fulltime students, and

WHEREAS, The inclusion of these students in the student body is a source of inspiration and pride for all of the College community, and

WHEREAS, The Connecticut State Department of Social Services provides the per day cost for care received by some of these students, and

WHEREAS, The Cost for tuition and fees would be burdensome for these students who receive only a very small weekly allowance from the Social Services Department, be it hereby

RESOLVED, That the President of Central Connecticut State College be authorized to waive the required student tuition and fees for patients at the New Britain Memorial Hospital who are permanently handicapped because of physical disabilities provided such patients are recommended by the Director of the Hospital and provided the Director of the Hospital certifies that without such waivers the patients would not be able to attend the College as students and, provided also, that the tuition waivers fall within the limits established by law, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Trustees will look with favor on similar arrangements made by the other Colleges.

Dear Jim:

As discussed at the recent meeting of the Council of Presidents, I am sending you a copy of a proposed resolution for presentation to the appropriate committee of the Board and for action by the Board of Trustees. You may remember I raised the concern about the procedure we have been following at Central for the past five years on waiver of tuition and fees for patients from the New Britain Memorial Hospital. When this matter came to my attention some years ago Clete and I worked out a procedure whereby we could allow the handicapped students to pursue their education at Central. I have discussed this matter recently with Clete in view of the auditors' report on Central and we both feel that Board action is necessary if we are to continue this practice.

Attached is a proposed resolution that might be submitted to the Board.

I have been very pleased that Central can provide the opportunities for permanently handicapped students to pursue their education. We have been delighted to have several such students graduate from the college and seek gainful employment in spite of their handicap.

I might also indicate I have had a recent request for a waiver of tuition from the Bureau of Rehabilitation Services of the State Department of Education. The request is for persons of similar physical disabilities to those at New Britain Memorial Hospital. The case presented is of a young woman who would require care such as that provided Dr. James A. Frost, Chief Executive Officer Page 2 March 16, 1976

at New Britain Memorial Hospital except she has an attendant living with her who is providing care. If appropriate, perhaps authority could be granted for waiver of tuition for cases such as that, also.

I will certainly be glad to discuss this further with you if you or the Board need further information for clarification.
