- III. Works cooperatively with the academic deans, directors and department heads in preparing, staffing and registering students in courses offered through the Extension College. (Evening Division and Summer Session)
- IV. Makes recommendations and reports deemed necessary to the Vice president for Academic Affairs regarding plans, procedures and practices within the Extension College. (Evening Division and Summer Session) He is also responsible for program development and the expansion of current services and offerings. He serves as an exofficio member of several college standing committees.

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
