INCREASE IN STUDENT LABORERS' WAGES

December 3, 1976

WHEREAS, The Trustees believe that the present wages paid to student workers are too low to compensate them adequately for the services they perform, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That State College Resolution #71-4 dated October 8, 1971 be repealed, and be it further

RESOLVED, That effective 13 January 1977 the minimum hourly rate of pay for student workers be increased from \$2.21 per hour to \$2.40 per hour, and be it

RESOLVED, That consistent with Item No. 8173c of the State
Personnel Policy Board a rate of up to \$2.75 per hour
may be used, by approval of the President of the College
and of the State Personnel Policy Board, for students
working in supportive technical, laboratory and administrative services, such positions to be distinguished
by the parenthetical (Technical Services), and be it

RESOLVED, That the amount spent for student workers during the course of any fiscal year shall not exceed the funds budgeted for that purpose.

## STUDENT LABORER

\$2.21 - \$2.50 per hour (Technical Services) up to \$2.75 per hour

This class is used by State agencies for miscellaneous part-time work by students enrolled in any school or college. The rate of \$2.21 - \$2.50 per hour applies to positions.

At the University of Connecticut and all other State institutions of higher education including the State Colleges, the State Regional Community Colleges and the State Technical Colleges, a rate of up to \$2.75 per hour may be used, by approval of the Personnel Policy Board, for students working in supportive technical, laboratory and administrative services. These positions will be distinguished by the parenthetical (Technical Services).

This cancels the existing specification for the same class approved effective July 16, 1976.
