RESOLUTION

concerning

ALTERATIONS TO STUDENT CENTER (MEMORIAL HALL)
at
CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE COLLEGE

July 15, 1977

WHEREAS, The Student Center Board of Governors of Central Connecticut State College has proposed a means for better utilizing certain areas of the Student Center, a proposal which the President of the College and his staff endorse, and

WHEREAS, The President of the College confirms that the cash balance in the Student Center Auxiliary Services Account is adequate to finance the costs of building alterations proposed by the Board of Governors and to support normal operations, and

WHEREAS, Section 10-114 of the General Statutes requires that projects costing over fifty thousand dollars must have the approval of the General Assembly or, when the General Assembly is not in session, of the Finance Advisory Committee, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees for State Colleges authorizes expenditures totaling no more than eighty-five thousand dollars (\$85,000) from the Student Center Auxiliary Services Account of Central Connecticut State College for the purpose of making alterations to first floor quad areas (Memorial Hall) of the Student Center, as described in a "Summary of Memorial Hall Alterations" dated June 1, 1977 and in a memorandum to the Public Works Department dated June 17, 1977, which show a total estimated cost of \$83,685, and be it

RESOLVED, That the Executive Director of the Connecticut State Colleges, acting in compliance with the provisions of Section 10-114 of the General Statutes, shall seek the approval of the State Finance Advisory Commission, or of the General Assembly if in session, to proceed with the project authorized herein by the Board of Trustees.

Alterations to Quad Areas at Memorial Hall

Permission is hereby granted to proceed with the alteration project which will be funded by your Student Center Auxiliary Service account and as described to Jack Wilcox from the Public Works Department at a meeting on the site, July 6, 1977. This work shall be required to meet all of the requirements of the State Fire Safety Code and the State Basic Building Code and all other State and Federal regulations. Particular attention should be given to the use of noncombustible materials in partition construction. Doors shall be 1-3/4" solid core construction and shall swing in the direction of egress travel. Interior finishes shall be Class "C".

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Summary of Memorial Hall Alterations

SW Quad - Student Office Spaces

Basic Plan - 13 individual student offices, a general work area and a conference area (see II attached).

Basic Requirements - offices to be divided by free-standing 6' high partitions in 3', 4' and 5' widths covered in carpet (similar to "Panel Concepts, Series 85"). There will be no doors on the offices.

Furniture - each office will have one 30" x 45" single-pedestal desk with locking drawers, a "Desk 'N File" unit, a 42" high 3 shelf bookcase and several chairs (one to be a swivel chair for the desk). The general work area will have a 4' x 6' work table, 10 "Desk 'N File" units for groups not assigned offices, and several chairs.

The conference area will have one 6' round table and several chairs.

Five extra bookcases will be in the general work area for transcient use.

Construction - a set of double doors will be installed at the east entrance so that the area may be locked off from the rest of the building. A single door will be installed at the end of the small corridor to the President's Dining Room to provide privacy for that area.

Other - alarms will be installed on the outside doors to discourage their use and prevent heat loss.

NE Quad - Expanded Dining Area

Basic Plan - To provide a larger, more attractive area for the noon hour and to provide a catered meal area for all campus groups in the evening.

Basic Requirements - Furniture

Promiture - There are already a sufficient number of tables and chairs for this area.

Construction - a set of double doors at the west entrance to provide security and prevent heat loss.

SE Quad - Gameroom

Posic Plan - to provide gameroom services similar to the Student Center Gameroom (see III attached).

Basic Requirements

Furniture - pool tables, table tennis, tables, chairs, and amusement machines already in place.

Construction - a set of double doors will be installed at the west entrance to provide security and prevent heat loss. A doorway is to be cut through the wall to the gameroom storage area. A counter must be fabricated to provide a compact service desk with locking cabinets. The present benches must be finished off and panelling will be put all around the room.

NW Quad - Meeting Room/Lounge Area

Basic Plan - to provide two meeting rooms and a lounge area.

Basic Requirements

Meeting Rooms to be divided from lounge area by 7' high, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " thick free standing partitions.

Furniture - There are already a sufficient number of chairs, tables, and lounge furniture for this area. The lounge furniture will be reupholstered.

Construction - a set of double doors will be installed at the east entrance for security and to prevent heat loss.

Permission is hereby requested to expend mousies from the Student Center Auxiliary Services account, to perform the following construction projects in the four (4) first floor quad areas of Mathorial Hali:

- 1. Erection of partitions in the ME, MW, SE, SW quad great and the installation of double doors. These doors will provide better security in the areas, control the flow of student traffic, and prevent heat loss,
- 2. Erection of a partition on the west side, adjacent to the rest rooms serving the Freeident's Dingue Room, and the installation of a single door. This door will esert. to control student traffic in the area.
- 3. Paneling half-way up the walls in the SW gameroom to protect the wall surfaces from damage and allow sasies cleaning of the area.
- A doorway is to be cut through a non-hearing wall inthe SN gameroon area to provide eccess to a storage area for gameroom supplies. A single door will be installed in this opening.
- A counter is to be fabricated to provide a compact service desk with looking cabinets for installation in the SW gameroom.
- 6. The present benches in the SW gameroom, first floor, Will be required and refinished.
