RESOLUTION

concerning

CAMPUS VISITS BY TRUSTEES

October 14, 1977

- WHEREAS, The Trustees desire to keep themselves directly informed of the concerns of students, faculty and staff, and
- WHEREAS, The Connecticut State College, American Association of University Professors Council in its resolution number 9-77-105 has welcomed campus visits by Trustees and has encouraged communication among Trustees, faculty members, and students, and
- WHEREAS, In a memorandum of agreement signed by Dr. David Newton on behalf of the Connecticut State College, American Association of University Professors and signed by Mr. James Malone on behalf of the State College Organization of Administrative Faculty-American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees and signed by Dr. Clinton Ritchie on behalf of the Trustees, it has been agreed that direct on-campus meetings between Trustees and faculty members will not be considered a violation of the collective bargaining contracts, will not be used as the basis for a charge of an unfair labor practice, and will not be used as a basis for grievance, and therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the Trustees will visit each college campus once during the fall semester and once during the spring semester to meet and converse with students, faculty and staff members, and be it
- RESOLVED, That the times of such meetings shall be established by the Chairman of the Board in consultation with the Executive Director and that, prior to consultation with the Chairman, the Executive Director shall consult with the College Presidents, and be it
- RESOLVED, That each College President shall inform the College Senate and the Student Government of the intention of the Trustees and shall obtain from each of these bodies suggestions concerning the time of such visits.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Whereas the parties to this Memorandum desire to guarantee the freedom of the Trustees to plan and carry out campus visits for the purpose of open exchange with students, faculty and administrators without the specter of an unfair labor charge, a grievance or a claimed violation of the collective bargaining agreement, we do herewith, on behalf of those whom we represent, agree that the Trustees' visits to the campuses will not be used as a basis for a charge of unfair labor practice, as the basis for grievance or as the basis for a charge of contract violation until further written notice.

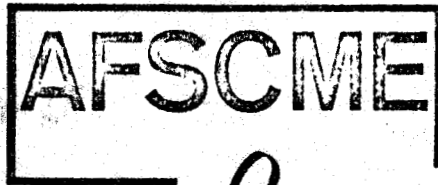
