RESOLUTION

concerning

GENERAL FUND OPERATING BUDGET REQUEST FOR 1979-1980

July 14, 1978

RESOLVED,

That the Board of Trustees for State Colleges, for its operating budget for 1979-1980, shall request of the Governor and the General Assembly appropriations totalling \$45,386,538, plus or minus one (1) per cent, representing an amount exclusive of any salary adjustment and related expenses that may result from collective bargaining agreements and/or from any reevaluation applicable to the 1979-1980 fiscal year that may be approved by the Personnel Division of the Department of Administrative Services, such total amount to be distributed by character designation in approximately the following amounts:

RESOLVED,

That this request shall be presented to the Board of Higher Education by the Executive Director of the Connecticut State Colleges, who shall work cooperatively with said Board and its staff to arrive at a budget request amount for the State Colleges which can be fully supported by the Board of Higher Education and the Board of Trustees for State Colleges, and be it

RESOLVED,

That, following submission of the aforementioned initial budget request to the Governor and the General Assembly, the Executive Director, after determination of additional costs that may result from collective bargaining agreements as ratified by the General Assembly and/or any costs that may result from additional reevaluation approved by the Personnel Division of the Department of Administrative Services applicable to the 1979-1980 fiscal year, shall request additional allocations from appropriate state agencies.

## Estimated General Fund Operating Budget 1979-1980

Over the years the Connecticut State Colleges have succeeded in meeting the changing curricular needs of students through the reassignment of faculty positions vacated as a result of attrition. Such vacant positions had been assigned to departments with growing enrollment. The change in the retirement age from 65 to 70 and the accelerating demands for new educational programs results in a situation where attrition is no longer adequate to provide the number of faculty positions needed for reassignment. The termination of tenured faculty must result in disruptions of the educational process because faculty members' concerns over job security may take precedence over concern for students. In any case terminations of persons who have served faithfully and well is inhumane and does not create a climate conducive to growth and improvement.

The Trustees desire to set aside \$40,000 in the year 1979-80 to provide expenses for the retraining of teachers who are now assigned to departments where enrollments have declined. Such retraining could enable teachers to change to fields where demand is higher. The funds would be used to meet the cost of tuition and fees with an allowance for books and instructional equipment.


