RESOLVED, That the Addendum to Resolution #79-52, dated April 6, 1979, be amended to increase the authorized expenditure for repairing the roof of Carroll Hall from \$16,000 to \$31,522 and to increase the authorized expenditure for repairing the roof of Barrows Hall from \$14,000 to \$29,550, both buildings being on the campus of Central Connecticut State College.
