RE: Status of Graduate Student Interns

It is my understanding that a problem has arisen regarding the status of Graduate Student Interns in relation to my memo to Campus Presidents on "Definition of Status of Students...," dated August 14, 1979.

My memo specified that graduate students who enroll for 9 semester hours or more were to be General Fund students. Trustees' Resolution #79-87, on the other hand, permitted Graduate Interns to enroll for 18 semester hours per year, which might well be translated into 9 hours per semester. The clear intent of Resolution #79-87, however, was to continue the Interns in the Extension program.

Therefore, I believe that you should continue as Extension Fund students during the Fall Semester the two or three Interns who are at present enrolled for 9 semester hours. In the meantime, we will have to find a way to make the provisions under which the Intern program operates consistent with the definition of General Fund and Extension Fund status for all graduate students.

I will ask Dr. Porter to develop a solution to this problem before the beginning of the Spring Semester.

3. The internship should be available in other areas of student affairs besides the student centers. The assistance of the interns can be used profitably by the institutions in a variety of areas and on the other hand the interns can profit from experience in these other areas too.

A revised version of the resolution is attached showing these changes.

One suggestion from individual Deans of Personnel, namely that the resolution be changed to provide for an annual 10-month appointment, was not agreed to by the Deans of Students. They prefer to have the resolution worded as it is now to provide compensation by the month. This present wording permits the appointment of interns during the summer or for a period of time different from the regular 10-month academic year. This flexibility is seen as highly desirably by the Deans of Students.

It is my understanding that this item will be on the June 21st Council of Presidents agenda.

After having reviewed a Student Center request for increase in the stipend for State College Interns with Dean Judd, I am recommending that an increase be approved in the amount of 7%. The Student Center request was for 15% and I believe all of the figures support such an increase. However, in view of the President's guidelines on 7% increase, I am recommending that the increase for the State College Interns be in conformity with those guidelines.

The University of Connecticut pays \$3500 for eight months service and requires 20 hours per week; the University of Rhode Island pays \$5250 for ten months service and requires 30 hours per week. 'The request for the Student Center Interns at Central is certainly in line with those institutions in that our interns are required to work a 30-50 hour week.

I would recommend that the resolution (SCR-76-52) which was approved by the Board of Trustees on June 4, 1976 be amended under the first resolve, point 2, to read: "stipend not to exceed \$380 per month of service during the first year, and not to exceed \$434 per month during the second year."

I would appreciate your presenting this recommendation to the appropriate committees of the Board.
