Dear Commissioner Manafort:

The Foard of Trustees for State Colleges by Resolution dated February 2, 1973 (copy attached) transferred title to the building and property of Camp School located at 15 Prospect Street to the Public Works Department effective July 1, 1973.

I have advised Mr. Dino Mucci by telephone on June 18, 1973 that we are in the process of cancelling all telephone, electrical, gas and fuel services to this property effective June 30, 1973.

Of primary concern to your department is the cancellation by Central Connecticut State College of the telephone circuit which connects the fire alarm system from Camp School to the Security Department at Central Connecticut State College and in turn is connected to the Fire House at 125 Columbus Boulevard in New Britain, Connecticut. The charge for this fire alarm circuit is \$4.90 per month, and you may wish to retain this circuit or to install a "game well" external alarm system at the Camp School Building.

Baker Brown and some of the Budget Division staff went out to look at the Camp School and speak to the local officials.

New Britain is planning on transferring the children from this school to the old high school in two or three years and would in all likelihood sell the Camp School.

It is suggested that the School property be transferred to the State Public Works Department. Public Works could lease it to the City for \$1 a year for the two or three years required. At the end of that period, the State could renovate the property for offices or other facilities or sell it.

Central Connecticut State College, New Britain, Conn., is phasing out its laboratory school operation which was used for the training of elementary school teachers. Camp School is to be phased out effective September 1, 1973. At that time the operation of this elementary school will revert to the Board of Education, New Britain, Conn.

Camp School, the land and building, is owned by the State of Connecticut. Central Connecticut State College has no further use for this property and requests that a bill be drafted transferring title of this property to the Board of Education, New Britain, Connecticut, effective July 1, 1973.



AN ACT AUTHORIZING CONVEYANCE OF A PAR-CEL OF LAND TO THE NEW BRITAIN BOARD OF EDUCATION....

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:


In consideration of the rapidly expanding role of the public 2 schools of New Britain in the teacher training program of 3 Central Connecticut State College, the state treasurer shall 4 convey to the city of New Britain, for use by its board of education, a certain parcel of land, containing approximately three 6 and thirty-eight hundredths acres, in the so-called Rockland 7 Project in said city, which is bounded by Green, Upton and 8 Lowell streets and the New Britain Industrial Park.






Building Built -- 1887
