ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CENTER FOR INFORMATION SERVICES at SOUTHERN CONNECTICUT STATE COLLEGE

January 9, 1981

WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the Division of Library Science and Instructional Technology at Southern Connecticut State College to include training in on-line information retrieval from remote data bases as part of the instruction program for the Master of Library Science Degree, and

Public and private school systems and other users in the WHEREAS, State of Connecticut need such information retrieval services, and

WHEREAS, It is anticipated that a Center for Information Services could provide such retrieval and should be able to do so on a financially self-sustaining basis, therefore, be it

RESOLVED. That there be and hereby is established a Center for Information Services at Southern Connecticut State College and that the cost of the said Center shall be met completely by user fees and grants available for such programs, and be it

RESOLVED. That at the meeting of the Trustees to be held in May of 1981, the Trustees will review the functioning of the Center, including income and expenses, and will determine whether the Center for Information Services will be discontinued as of June 30, 1981, or will be continued beyond that date.

THE CENTER FOR INFORMATION SERVICES at
Southern Connecticut State College

September 4, 1981

WHEREAS, Trustees Resolution #81-4 which established the Center for Information Services at Southern Connecticut State College provided that the Center should be self-sustaining on the basis of users fees and grants, and

WHEREAS, The Center has established the appropriate relationships with data bases and has begun to receive requests for data searches which can provide appropriate learning experiences for graduate students and simultaneously generate income to meet the expenses of the Center, and

WHEREAS, The Center has sufficient resources derived from users fees and grants to continue to operate for another six-months, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Center for Information Services at Southern Connecticut State College may continue to operate, and be it

RESOLVED, That at the meeting of the Trustees to be held in March 1982, the Trustees will review the functioning of the Center including income and expenses, and will determine whether the Center for Information Services will be discontinued as of April 30, 1982, or will be continued beyond that date.
