Dear Jim.

Consistent with our earlier discussions as to my current and future status with the Board, I herewith apply for retirement under the Gonnecticut State Employees Retirement System, effective April 1, 1981. With my accumulated sick leave and accrued vacation leave exhausted on or near that date, and, with no prospect of a cure to my cancer, I have no alternative but to retire, albeit with deeply mixed feelings.

As you are well aware, my work with the Board these past nine years (eight of them with you!) has been truly meaningful to me-ever demanding yet always rewarding. Thus you can understand that I was not ready to give it up prematurely. But in coming so close to death and in having gained even so temporary a reprieve through an aggressive medical program, I have come to a new appreciation of what wonderful blessings each new day brings if used and shared with those I love. Only through such a discovery, painful and agonizing though it has been, can I leave the work and the workplace so dear to me, knowing that there is fullness in each moment of my life, wherever I spend it, as long as I live that moment respectful of its potential specialness to me and to those around me who care. Therein the trauma of the illness and its consequent effect on my professional life provide meaning useful to me, my family and our friends. I can therefore leave with newfound joy in whatever time there is left to me.

In effecting my retirement we wish to continue our medical benefits and my life insurance at current levels. The cost, I understand, is reasonable and will be deducted from my retirement check. Ms. Susan Fabian is the Retirement Counselor most familiar with my situation and account, having worked closely with Charlotte last March when everything looked so suddenly bleak for us. I await advice as to next steps. Ed Dombroskas has been very helpful in assisting me with Blue Cross/Blue Shield red tape and that agency's studied resistance to make payment in a timely manner. He was particularly helpful also in relaying Peg Shapiro's suggestion about applying for Social Security disability insurance.

Please convey to the Board, especially Larry and the Personnel Committee, to the Presidents, to members of ERAC, and to the entire office staff my profound appreciation not only for evidence of their caring during this time of need but also, especially, for the privilege of working together through the years in so many exciting professional ventures. My life with you, the Board and the staff has been full. I am the richer for every minute of it. Charlotte joins me in a heartfelt thank you!

- WHEREAS, The Trustees are very much aware of the heavy workload carried by Dr. Clinton M. Ritchie in his capacity as Executive Officer for Academic Affairs and are very grateful for the excellence with which he has carried out these responsibilities, and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Ritchie has stated that he would prefer to serve as Executive Officer for Student, Faculty, and Staff Affairs rather than Executive Officer for Academic Affairs, therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Trustees express their appreciation to Dr. Ritchie for his diligence and for the excellence of his service to the Board, and be it
- RESOLVED, That in deference to his wishes, Dr. Clinton M. Ritchie is relieved of his duties as Executive Officer for Academic Affairs and is appointed to the position hereby established as Executive Officer for Student, Faculty, and Staff Affairs at State Salary Group 37, Step 7, effective June 18, 1976.

PROVIDING A

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE PROFESSORSHIP

for

DR. CLINTON M. RITCHIE

January 12, 1979

WHEREAS,	The Trustees have provided a Distinguished Service Professor- ship for all Central Staff Executive Officers except Dr. Clinton M. Ritchie, the Executive Officer for Faculty and Staff Affairs, and
WHEREAS,	In recognition of his years of excellent service the Trustees wish to provide Dr. Clinton Ritchie with a Distinguished Service Professorship, and
WHEREAS,	In providing Distinguished Service Professorships the Trustees have retained their authority to dismiss any Executive Officer when they believe such action is in the best interests of the Connecticut State Colleges and yet have provided job security in the event that the Board of Trustees for the Connecticut State Colleges should cease to exist or should be combined with other boards, board, commission, or commissions, now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED,	That, effective January 12, 1979, Dr. Clinton Ritchie is re- lieved of his assignment as Executive Officer for Faculty and Staff Affairs and is assigned to Eastern Connecticut State College as a Distinguished Service Professor at an annual salary of \$35,000, and be it
RESOLVED,	That, effective immediately, Dr. Ritchie is placed on leave as a Distinguished Service Professor and is assigned to serve as a member of the Trustees' Executive Staff with the title Executive Officer for Faculty and Staff Affairs at an annual salary of

\$40,000.00, and be it

RESOLVED, That Dr. Ritchie shall continue on leave and shall continue to serve as Executive Officer for Faculty and Staff Affairs until one or more of the following conditions occur: (1) the Board of Trustees for the Connecticut State Colleges ceases to exist or is combined with one or more other boards or commissions (2) the Board determines that it no longer required Dr. Ritchie's services, or (3) Dr. Ritchie decides to leave the Board's service, and be it further

RESOLVED,

That should the Board of Trustees for the Connecticut State Colleges cease to exist or should the said Board be combined with other boards or commissions, Dr. Ritchie's leave shall be deemed to have been cancelled and he shall immediately take up his position as Distinguished Service Professor at Eastern Connecticut State College and from that time on he shall hold a continuing appointment (tenure) in his position as Distinguished Service Professor at Eastern Connecticut State College.
