#### AN INCREASE IN HOUSING FEES

December 3, 1982

WHEREAS, Section 10-116 of the General Statutes provides that the Board of Trustees for State Colleges, subject to the approval of the Board of Higher Education, shall fix fees for such purposes as the Board of Trustees deems necessary, and

WHEREAS, Revenue produced at current rates is not sufficient to cover escalating costs due to inflation, increased rates for fuel and utilities, and salary adjustments, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That, if the Board of Higher Education concurs, effective with the Fall Semester 1983, room and apartment fees shall be established as shown in the addendum to this resolution, and be it

RESOLVED, That, if the Board of Higher Education concurs, rental rates for rooms to be occupied during the summer session shall be prorated in accordance with the fee schedule shown in the addendum to this resolution, commencing with the Summer Session of 1983, and be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees will review housing fees on an annual basis and will, after discussion with the Student Advisory Board, request changes, if necessary, before March 1 of each year.
