SAMSON OCCUM HALL at EASTERN CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY

September 1, 1983

WHEREAS, Samson Occum (1723-1792), a Mohegan Indian from New London, Connecticut, was educated at the Indian Charity School of Lebanon (now Columbia) Connecticut and achieved fame throughout New

England as a minister, educator, and missionary, and

WHEREAS, Samson Occum played an instrumental role in the conversion and relocation of the Charity School from Lebanon to Dartmouth College

in Hanover, New Hampshire, and

WHEREAS, Samson Occum devoted his later years to his role as a leader of

New England tribes in their efforts to maintain independence and

preserve their cultures, and

WHEREAS, Eastern Connecticut State University has named other residence

halls after Eastern Connecticut historical figures such as Prudence Crandall, John Winthrop, and Daniel Burnap, now therefore

be it

RESOLVED, That the new residence hall now nearing completion on the North

Campus of Eastern Connecticut State University be named Samson

Occum Hall.
