AN INCREASE IN EDUCATIONAL EXTENSION FUND FEES

February 3, 1984

WHEREAS, Examination of the status of the Educational Extension Fund accounts of the several campuses, giving consideration to the projection of credit hour fee needs for the 1984-85 academic year, indicates that fee increases are required, be it

RESOLVED, That, subject to the approval of the Board of Governors of Higher Education, the Board of Trustees for the Connecticut State University authorizes, effective for the Summer 1984 Session, changes in credit hour fees for the Educational Extension Programs, Summer Session, and Intersession as follows:

- 7/ Currently charging \$58 UG and \$70 Grad. Deficit due not only to charging less than maximum rate/cr.hr., but also "reduction of prior year surplus included in expenditures."
- 8/ Fund balance on July 1, 1983 was \$616,260. College requested fee increase of \$4/cr.hr. Fund balance was reduced by establishment of a \$300,000 operating reserve during 1983-84.
- 9/ College requested an additional increase of \$5/cr.hr. This will generate an additional \$260,675 at the estimated credit hour level.

- 10/ Fiscal year 1982-83, shows a 19.8% increase in Total Expenses over 1981-82. Currently charging maximum of \$63 UG and \$76 Grad.* Fund balance on July 1, 1983 was \$172,914.
- 11/ College is requesting an increase of \$13 per credit hour for the two-year period. This would produce \$714,000. An increase of \$10 would cover deficits of \$526,859 for 1984-85 through 1985-86 and establish a fund balance of approximately 10% of the fund activity.

*Summer session charges were \$58 UG and \$70 Grad.

Note: Western's ratio of full-time costs to total P.S. costs = 44.6% for FY 1984 through FY 1986, excluding fringe benefits (highest in system). Western's total expenses/cr.hr. range between \$65 and \$70 for FY 1984 through FY 1986 (system avgs. = \$62 in FY 84; \$63 in FY 85; \$66 in FY 86).
