June 15, 1984

WHEREAS,	The John Lyman Auditorium is used primarily for events and activities of the performing arts, and
WHEREAS,	The Faculty, Staff and Students, including the Cultural Affairs Club, the Music, Theatre, Dance and Art Departments at Southern Connecticut State University recommend that the name of the John Lyman Auditorium be changed to the John Lyman Center for the Performing Arts, and
WHEREAS,	The Family of John Lyman supports this change, and
WHEREAS,	The President of Southern Connecticut State University has endorsed this change in name, therefore be it
RESOLVED,	That the John Lyman Auditorium at Southern Connecticut State

University be renamed the John Lyman Center for the Performing Arts.

There are two possible complications with the proposed name:

- (1) "Center" usually means a "center for the study of---"
- (2) The designation "performing arts" seems to give the facility to the fine arts programs and exclude others. The more neutral title, auditorium, does not do this.

However, despite the above, I don't see enough of a problem to tell the campus they can't make the change. If we approve it, we should get a commitment from Harrison and Nowlan that it is not a step toward a proposal of a music major for Southern.
