Dear Sandy:

I am pleased to forward to you Eastern's revised application for licensure of a bachelor's program in Communications.

You already have the Trustees resolution authorizing this, but I am enclosing an extra copy for your convenience.

The analyses by our consultant, Professor Thomas Donohue, are enclosed also. These are two documents, one focusing on Eastern and the other on our existing majors in Communications at Central, Southern and Western.

The faculty at Eastern found Dr. Donohue's report to be most helpful, and their response is attached to the application as well as being reflected in the substance of it. Our other campuses are still considering Donohue's comments and have not yet given us their responses. As you will see, however, Donohue's specific suggestions for the other campuses are not relevant to Eastern's application.

One small glitch which I detect in Eastern's document and which I hope you will be tolerant of is that page 26 of appendix B is incorrect. This is the second page of the fiscal impact statement. The version included was rejected by Ms. Bascetta a year ago. The version Ms. Bascetta approved is enclosed without being bound into the document. We will be working on an up-date and will get it to you as soon as possible.

We want to thank you for your assistance with this program. I do believe that it is a stronger one as the result of everyone's effort.
