AN INCREASE IN THE RESIDENCE HALL SOCIAL FEE AT WESTERN CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY

June 6, 1986

WHEREAS, The Inter-Residence Hall Council at Western Connecticut State University has voted to increase the Residence Hall Social Fee from five dollars per year to ten dollars per year, and

WHEREAS, This fee supports various desirable educational, social, cultural and service programs for the benefit of residents, and

WHEREAS, Despite the inroads of inflation, the fee rate has not been increased for nearly ten years, be it

RESOLVED, That, if the Board of Governors for Higher Education gives its approval, an increase from five dollars per year to ten dollars per year in the Residence Hall Social Fee at Western Connecticut State University is approved, to be effective starting with the Fall 1986 semester.
