POSITION TITLE:

Director of the Advising Center

ADMINISTRATIVE RANK:

Under the supervision of the Vice-President for Academic Affairs, the Director of the Advising Center is responsible for the operation of the University Advising Center including the supervision and evaluation of all staff and center activities. Responsibilities also include:

- 1. Administers faculty advisement for all undeclared majors.
- 2. Conducts instrusive advising activities.
- 3. Directs a clearing house operation for the dissemination of all academic information.
- 4. Administers the process of hearing student academic appeals.
- 5. Maintains effective liaison with academic deans, departmental faculty advisors and student affairs staff.
- 6. Provides campus wide leadership in developing innovative advising and retention programming.
- 7. Coordinates various special academic advising programs.
- 8. Develops grant proposals to obtain outside funding assistance to support the center.
- 9. Recommends policies and procedures to insure that center activities keep pace with changes in the field.
- 10. Performs duties related to those listed above which do not alter the overall responsibility level of the position.

QUALIFICATIONS

At least four years experience in learning/education assistance programs in an institution of higher education. Previous experience in teaching and/or grant development desired. Masters degree is required.

These qualifications may be waived for individuals with appropriate alternate experience.
