Dear Dr. Baiera,

The artist signed limited edition lithographic prints enclosed are being donated to the English Department of the Central CT State University by Mr. Ron Rakow.

Mr. Rakow requested that we arrange for the delivery of the prints and that they be entrusted to a representative of the university. Your kind assistance is, therefore, greatly appreciated.

These prints are part of a series based on the bestselling fiction works of the American writer and humanitarian L. Ron Hubbard. Several years ago Author Services, which represents the literary, theatrical and musical works of Mr. Hubbard, commissioned leading artists from around the world to depict scenes from his futuristic social satire, the MISSION EARTH dekalogy (ten volumes) for a special science fiction calendar and set of lithographic prints.

Each volume of the series has since become a New York Times and international bestseller while many of the prints are now in the hands of private collectors and galleries.

Those who have read MISSION EARTH will share a keen enjoyment of each of the artist's visual interpretation of Mr. Hubbard's fiction creations, but anyone seeing the prints will appreciate the intrinsic value of the art

It is noteworthy that the images were reproduced using a unique continuous tone printing process requiring multiple separate print runs. They were printed by Black Box Collotype, the only company in the United States who employs this state of the art lithographic process.

L. Ron Hubbard always held artists in high esteem and wrote: "A culture is only as great as its dreams and its dreams are dreamed by artists."

To assist aspiring artists, Mr. Hubbard started two competitions -- The Writers of the Future and Illustrators of the Future Contests. Substantial cash prizes and the opportunity to have their work published in the bestselling L. Ron Hubbard Presents Writers of the Future volumes, have attracted many entrants and resulted in a significant number entering professional careers in the

As your students may be interested in these competitions, I have enclosed copies of the rules and entry forms, which will give additional information about the

I know Mr. Rakow will be grateful that you have accepted this gift and will display them where they can be seen by students to encourage them in the field of the arts as well as enhance the decor of your department.

Dear Mr. Resnick,

I received a call today from your assistant Marilyn concerning the art prints that were donated to your university, wanting to know their cost. I have attached a portion of our catalogue giving the official prices and have circled the prints that have been sent to you for easy reference.

However, you should know several things concerning their value. First, all the prints are signed limited editions from a run of only 500 copies. As time goes on they become increasingly rare and so the value increases. Secondly, the artists are all growing in fame and prestige so the future value escalates on that score as well. Third, with the L. Ron Hubbard name associated with the art, the value increases significantly among collectors. For example, in the collectors' book market the L. Ron Hubbard name always commands top dollar. Some hand-signed books have been sold for as much as \$20,000, while a Hubbard story in a 10 cent magazine (unsigned) from say 1940, might sell for as much as \$400 today.

Well, I hope the information provided is sufficient for your needs.

Incidentally, we are always interested in hearing any feedback on the art, so if you or a colleague have the opportunity, do take a moment to write.
