



RESOLUTION

concerning

THE FULL-TIME ENROLLMENT OF CHARTER OAK STATE COLLEGES STUDENTS IN THE CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM AND THEIR TUITION AND FEES

July 22, 1994

WHEREAS, Public Act 94-180 makes students who are enrolled in Charter Oak State College and who are taking courses at other state colleges and universities, eligible for state student financial aid at those colleges and universities under the Connecticut Aid for Public College Students (CAPCS) Program, and

WHEREAS, The purpose of this legislation is to allow those needy students enrolled in Charter Oak State College to pursue their external degree requirements at other state institutions under the same conditions that their fellow enrollees enjoy, and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees of the Connecticut State University system recognizes the value in providing such administrative equity for Connecticut residents regardless of the constituent unit in which they are enrolled, and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees has maintained various agreements with the other units of Connecticut public higher education in order to promote educational access and equity, and

WHEREAS, Such agreements include previous board resolutions pertaining to Charter Oak State College students and their transferability to the Connecticut State University system (BR #76-55 and BR #81-73, and

WHEREAS, The Board is committed to treating Charter Oak state College students as their own for other administrative purposes in order to promote the long-standing CSU goal of access and equity, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees adopts the policy of considering Charter Oak State College students enrolled in full-time studies at any of the universities that comprise the Connecticut State University system, as full-time students for tuition and fee purposes, and be it further

RESOLVED, That on those rare instances that Charter Oak State College students are enrolled full-time at any of the universities that comprise the Connecticut State University system, they shall be charged the appropriate full-time tuition and fees.
