- RESOLVED, That Board Resolution 94-106, a resolution concerning microcomputer procurement, be rescinded, and be it further
- That microcomputer purchases within the Connecticut State University System RESOLVED, be standardized on the following brands: Apple, Compaq, Digital Equipment Corporation, Gateway, IBM, Zenith and Hewlett-Packard, and be it further
- That henceforth the President of the Connecticut State University system is RESOLVED, authorized to approve additions or deletions to the list of personal computers authorized for purchase by the universities and system office.
