RESOLUTION

concerning

UNIVERSALLY TRANSFERABLE GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES IN CONNECTICUT PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION

March 29, 1996

WHEREAS, Connecticut Public Act 95-148 mandated that the Commissioner of Higher Education convene an Advisory Committee on Transfer and Articulation to consider "core courses to be approved by the Board of Trustees of all public institutions of higher education for which a student may transfer credit toward...completion requirements at any institution within the state system of higher education..." and

WHEREAS, The Commissioner of Higher Education has convened such a council which included representation of all four Connecticut State Universities plus the System Office and which recommended a pattern of general education courses which are generally available in the Community Technical Colleges and which can be transferred to all Connecticut State Universities and to the University of Connecticut without violating existing curricular requirements, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees for the Connecticut State University on behalf of Central, Eastern, Southern, and Western Connecticut State Universities approves the attached list of general education courses for transfer to universities in the CSU System in fulfillment of degree requirements.

All two-year college students are urged to consult their transfer counselors early in the course selection process to determine which courses will fulfill not only general education requirements of the transfer university but which may also fulfill requirements of the intended major.

The above courses will only partially fulfill general education requirements of the universities in the CSU system. Transfer students will be required to complete additional general education requirements of the specific receiving university.

- "Humanities other than literature" consists of Philosophy or foreign language
- ++ Mathematics courses must be true collegiate level courses, not repeat of secondary content.
