#### **ITEM**

University Mission Statement for Central Connecticut State University

#### **BACKGROUND**

Throughout 1998 the four CSU universities worked with the faculty and staff in crafting individual mission statements which would define their distinct characteristics within the CSU system.

These mission statements together with the system mission form the foundation for strategic planning for the CSU universities.

The Board of Governors for Higher Education has recently adopted a five point agenda entitled "Transforming Connecticut Postsecondary Education". One of the "five points" is Define distinct missions and roles in the public higher education sector to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the public system.

The university mission statements will be submitted to the Board of Governors for their use in reviewing and approving academic programs offered by CSU.

#### **ANALYSIS**

The mission statement submitted by Central Connecticut State University President, Richard L. Judd, is undergoing final review by the faculty and favorable action is anticipated prior to the February 5, 1999 meeting of the CSU Board of Trustees.

Central Connecticut State University defines itself as "Connecticut's premier learner centered public university with teaching as its focus."
